Through support groups, individual treatment plans, mentoring, devotional study, Bible Study, a strong work regiment and community service supported by a loving, affirming local congregation for eighteen months, the brothers will be given another chance to put together a life that they can be proud of.

### **The following goals for the year 2010 were met:**

- We were blessed to have one graduate which is now a productive member of society
- Added three new staff members (administrator, financial assistant, and a financial advisor)
- We received a grant from United Way in the amount of \$3,500 for the use of food.
- We graduated seven (7) men from Intermediate Computer Class
- Manasseh and Ephraim residents volunteered at 2 sites this month *1.* Salvation Army (Boys and Girls Club) and *2.* Beaumont Ave Apartments along with the Burlington Police Dept, Alamance County Gang Coordinator for Community Awareness Day, to create a better relationship between Law enforcement and the community.
- Established a weekly regiment plan to ensure all men complete five hours of Community Service a week
- New Partnership was created with Alcohol Drug Services (Sand hills) from Asheboro NC
- Meeting with Burlington Police Dept (Weed and Seed) to volunteer for Community Awareness Day. Their objective is to create a better relationship between Law enforcement and the community.
- Met with Kent Smith at the Alamance County Mental Health Dept for partnership with assisting residents with medication
- Manasseh and Ephraim residents volunteered at East Brook Apartments along with the Burlington Police Dept, Alamance County Gang Coordinator for Community Awareness Day, to create a better relationship between Law enforcement and the Community.
- Engaged Residents in an 8-week curriculum, Insurance/Investments (Keith Cobbin-Independent Agent) and Money Management (Charles Morgan - Edward Jones)
- Completed two sessions of Aftercare for two Families
- Attended a Grants workshop from United Way
